Food and Beverage Ontario Innovation Project - Innovation Resources

Based on the interviews and secondary research conducted, a database was established to consolidate the identified innovation resources, which were divided into two categories. The first category includes physical assets, which includes resources that have a physical location where the service is delivered primarily at the physical location. Examples include incubators, accelerators, and post-secondary research or training institutions. The second category is information-based resources, which includes programs and services that are delivered through a variety of channels, including print, online, and in person.

Development of database

The secondary research cast a wide net to include any resources that may be of use to processors who are interested in innovation in its broadest sense.

The web research produced a total of 50 physical assets, with some assets having multiple locations throughout Ontario. Physical assets include incubators, research centres, post-secondary research and education institutions, and economic development offices. Some offer programs and services limited to the region in which they are located. One such example is the Toronto Food Policy Council, whose work is only limited to the Toronto area. However, many physical assets, such as research centres and post-secondary institutions are not limited by their physical locations. While research is being conducted at the physical center, its results can be used by businesses from all over Canada. The same goes for post-secondary programs, where eligible applicants from other provinces can apply to study in the programs offered in Ontario's universities and colleges. Any asset where the service/program is primarily delivered/conducted at the physical location has been characterized as a physical asset.

In addition to the physical assets, the database includes 65 information resources which provide an accurate cross section of the types of resources available online, in print, and in-person. Efforts were made to include all of the most important resources, but the database is not exhaustive and will evolve with the industry. Each resource in the database is categorized according to its capability, geographical region served, and whether it provides business or operational assistance. Resources were classified in these ways to provide a quick understanding of what, who, and where the resource is and to help users narrow down to the resources most useful to them.

A summary of the database structure and findings of the research follows.

Database Structure

- 1. Physical asset resources are described by their name, physical location and general services available.
- 2. Information-based resources are described by their various attributes as described below.

The information-based resources primarily fall under five categories –business and/or operational information, financial support, research, advisory and advocacy. The information may be delivered online, in printed material, through webinars, by phone or by in-person sessions. Many resources offer multiple capabilities. The database is intended to be a work-in-progress that evolves with the sector.

Business/operational Information – provides material or programs such as how to start-up or expand a business, industry news, productivity improvements, partnerships, marketing and exporting.

Financial support – provides financial support to processors for investments in innovative projects or equipment. These programs are delivered in the form of cash disbursements, loans or tax incentives.

Research – provides information on research programs aimed to assist with development of new products, technologies, equipment, marketing, and processes that will advance the food industry

Advisory – provides mentoring, training, and advisory services for business related activities and food and beverage research projects.

Advocacy – promotes the sector and/or geographical region through representations to stakeholders; offering programs and services to sustain existing businesses, and attracting new businesses to the region.

Resource – the name of the program, publication, service, or information for identification purposes

Organization - the name of the organization which offers the resource or leads the initiative

Overview – a description of the organization and/or specific resource offered

Sector – the sector the organization offering the resource belongs to

Geographical area – the geographical area which the resources serve

Applicability to small, medium, large businesses – indicates whether the program, publication, service or information is applicable for small, medium and/or large businesses

Website Link – provides the URL of the website for users to access more information about the resource and other programs that might be available.

Contact information – provides the address, phone number, fax, email where available for processors to reach the program/organization for enquiries.
